School readiness has very little to do with academic development



School Readiness has more to do with your child's social and emotional development

The Law \dots

Children need to be at school by their 6th Birthday.



Children can start as early as 4 ½. Their birthday needs to be on or before 31st July in the year they start school.



Confident children thrive.

- Following instructions
- Asking for help
- Trying new things
- Persisting with tasks
- Making choices
- Answering questions



Encourage your child to be independent.

- eating
- dressing
- toileting
- looking after their own belongings



Social skills are essential

- Considers others and doesn't always need to be the 'boss' or 'first'.
- Expresses how they feel in ways that don't upset others
- Waits for turn to talk and doesn't interrupt.
- Shares and takes turns in games.



What can parents do to minimise stress?

- Be organised give yourself plenty of time in the morning
- Develop a Monday Friday routine for school term.
- Label everything

Getting your child ready for school


- *Make sure your child can use the toilet independently
- * Go for a walk together and practise crossing roads safely
- * Set up a play date for your child to play with a friend
- * Go to the local library and let your child choose books to borrow
- * Take a ball to the park to throw, catch and kick together

*Let your child practise:

- Putting on school shoes and walking in them
- Dressing in their school uniform
- Writing alphabet letters
- Cutting and pasting pictures from a magazine and drawing pictures.


What is Best Start?
