# Sentral Parent Portal

Our school is currently undertaking a new initiative, the Sentral Parent Portal, which will provide parents with discreet information about their child/children's progress in our school.

After a successful parent trial period in 2020, we have decided that Semester 1 academic reports will be made available digitally to all parents via the Sentral Parent Portal. This will allow parents to access academic reports at any point from Thursday, Week 10 by viewing or downloading a copy from the portal.

On Monday 31 May, all parents and carers received an email from the school with an individualised Sentral Parent Portal key to sign up. If you have a gmail account please check your spam folder. Included with this email was an attachment file with step by step instructions on how to complete the sign-up process to the LEPS Sentral Parent Portal. If you require further assistance signing up, please give our office a call and they will help you further over the phone.

As we progress this initiative, I am confident that the Sentral Parent Portal will strengthen communication and assist with day to day management of your child's enrolment at Lindfield East Public School.

# HAVE YOU CHANGED YOUR CONTACT DETAILS?

It is very important that the school has up to date contact details. This week we have sent home with your child a form with current information held relating to phone numbers, emails, home address, emergency contacts and health conditions. This will be for all students in Kindergarten to Year 5. Year 6 notes were sent out at the beginning of the year.

If the details are correct, there is no need to return the form.

To request to change and update any information, please clearly make the changes on the form then sign and date the form and return the form to the school office.

## Menindee Excursion

On Monday 31st May sixteen Year 6 students went with Ms Walker and Mr Christmas out to Menindee and Broken Hill for a week. We set off early on Monday morning to embark on our long train journey. After 12 hours we arrived at Menindee and stayed at Menindee Central School's accommodation, which are old train carriages. While in Menindee, students gained first hand experience of life in a small rural town. We participated in lessons at Menindee Central school, a K-12 school of approximately 100 students. Students were privileged to watch a performance conducted by the staff and students about the life of one of the local Elders and her experience being part of the Stolen Generation.

Students also enjoyed a river cruise on Menindee Lakes which was spectacular given how much water has flowed down the Darling recently filling up the lakes for the first time in years. While in Menindee we made Johnny cakes around a fire and explored Kinchega National Park.

While in Broken Hill the students toured the Albert Kersten Mining & Minerals Museum, the Pro Hart Art Gallery, the Daydream Mine and visited the Mundi Mundi lookout. Students also participated in a tour of The Royal Flying Doctor Service base and the School of the Air. We learned all about how different life in the country is compared to life in the city and how valuable these services are for many people across the country. We visited the Amanya Mitha Aboriginal Art Gallery where students had a lesson in Aboriginal painting.

On Friday after an exciting and educational week we flew home. Our heads and hearts were filled with many memories about our time away in western New South Wales.



### **Reading Professional Learning**

This year, as an initiative in our School Improvement Plan, teachers at LEPS are undertaking professional learning in partnership with Joanne Rossbridge, a language and literacy professional learning consultant. On Thursday Joanne conducted a reading demonstration lesson with 5JW that focused on explicit teaching strategies. This productive partnership will continue throughout the year. In Week 10 Joanne will again be at LEPS conducting professional learning with staff from eight neighbouring schools.

# Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the *NCCD guidelines* (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information. # Killara Schools Partnership Girls Mathematics Workshop

On Wednesday 2 June, Year 4 girls from Lindfield East Public School, Killara Public School and Beaumont Road Public School went to Killara High School for a Mathematics workshop! We were learning about fractals (patterns that keep going and going) and it was very interesting. They also had Year 7 and 8 students who helped them, and the younger students chatted with some who used to go to their schools.

For the first bit, the students completed some worksheets about fractals by completing pictures of fractals, colouring them in, and creating their own. Some of it was a bit tricky, but the teachers helped. They learnt interesting facts about fractals and were shown pictures of them that occur in real life! Some of these were in trees, ferns, and even the Eiffel Tower! For the second half, they made 3D models of triangular fractals with mini marshmallows and toothpicks. For this bit, some Year 7s came in and helped the Year 3 students create their models. Each person made a small triangular pyramid, which they joined with others to make a larger triangular pyramid with a hole in the centre. They then got 4 of those and joined those, but this part was trickier because they kept falling apart. Some of the models were a bit more stable than others.

The students said it was fun and really educational and that it was good to get a break from their own school and go to see someone else's. They declared that they would like to do it again.
