Covid-19 Update

As of Wednesday 19 August there are new regulations for schools and parents to adhere to:

- Students do not attend school if they are unwell.
- Students absent or sent home due to feeling unwell or displaying flu like symptoms must be tested.
- Students must not return to school until they return a negative COVID-19 result and are symptom free.
- Schools **must sight the negative COVID-19 test result** prior to allowing students and staff to return to school.
- Additionally, if your child is at home due to an unspecified illness, a clearance certificate is required from a doctor before they return to school.
- Parents/carers are not to enter the school site without permission. If parents need to enter the school they must head directly to the office and sign the 'visitor acknowledgement form'.
- Students who return to school and have not followed the regulations above will have their parent contacted and the student will be sent home.
- *Every morning please check that your child has their drink bottle, hat and any other requirements as we do not have the capacity to deliver these to students during the day.*
- Creative workshops, band and string group and individual lessons have been cancelled for Term 3.

- Group singing (choirs) and/or other chanting activities, as well as the use of wind instruments in group settings, are not permitted. Special arrangements are in place for HSC students.
- School formals, dances, graduation or other social events are not permitted. Schools may hold a Year 12 assembly at school without parents to recognise the completion of school.
- Where possible, students will stay within their relevant cohort group for all learning activities within their school in order to limit close contacts to the relevant student cohort.
- Interschool activities must remain within the local community or zone e.g. interschool sport and physical activities, curriculum activities, arts activities and extra-curricular activities organised or sponsored by the school.

Term 3 Mandarin Program

This term, Kindergarten are busy learning all about colours in Mandarin. They talked about their favourite colours, and learned all the colours of the rainbow. They even created a little booklet of colours to help them remember all the new words.

Year 1 students are learning about body parts this term in Mandarin. They played games related to the topic and had fun drawing self-portraits and monsters and labelling all the different parts.

Students in year 2 are learning about sea creatures. They have been doing a lot of crafts and games to help them remember the new vocabulary.

Year 3 students are busy practising the four tones, as well as familiarising themselves with the spelling of pinyin. They participated in many listening activities to help with the pronunciation. They are also learning words and grammar structures relating to housework.

Year 4 is learning about our community this term. The vocabulary include the people and places in our community. They are also learning to give and receive directions in Mandarin.

Year 5 students are learning about clothing in Mandarin. They learnt about the history and evolution of clothing in China. They have also been busy creating some fantastic outfits.

Trying traditional food is always important for one to fully immerse into another culture – so Year 6 students this term are learning phrases to help them order Chinese food at a restaurant. They are also learning about Chinese dining etiquette, and creating a set menu on their favourite Chinese dishes to have at a restaurant.

Placement in an opportunity class will be based solely on the results of the test to ensure the fair and consistent assessment of students across all schools and regions of NSW.

Primary Mathematics School Initiatives (PMSI)

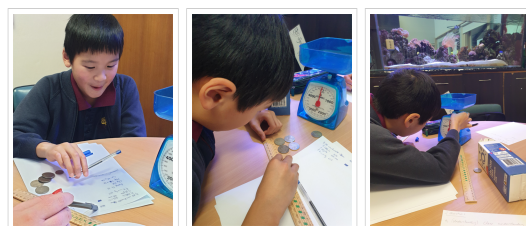
Miss Cannell and Miss Morgan participated in the 3rd installment of the Primary Mathematics Schools Initiative (PMSI) for three days on 5-7 August. They worked with staff from seven other schools in the region to deepen their understanding on the topics:

- Assessment for Learning: Purpose, Pitfalls, Possibilities and Practicalities.
- Happy, Healthy, Cheerful, Productive Classrooms: Working Mathematically.
- Rich and Balanced Maths Programs.

Both teachers participated in some collaborative, practical, higher-order thinking tasks together and then tested some questions on our Mathematics "Whiz-kid" Ethan C. Although it was exhausting, it was a worth-while and interesting three days. They can not wait to get into classrooms to put their newly-found knowledge into practice. Hopefully their love for Mathematics will rub off on the students and staff.

'On Friday 7 August, I went to the office and participated in a Zoom Maths event. I worked on problems while the teachers looked at how I was working out the questions. One of the problems was 'How many people are turning 46 today in Australia?' Another problem was to find out which scenario has the most money. I had an excellent time in the meeting and I found it very interesting having to complete the challenging puzzles.'

K-2 and 3-6 Literacy Resources: Teacher Professional Learning.

This week our teachers were introduced to some new reading resources.

K-2 staff and some specialist staff were introduced to the online literacy program 'Bug Club'. This program is designed to support the effective and engaging teaching of reading for students. There are over 360 expertly levelled fiction and non-fiction guided readers, phonic fiction readers, comics and graphic novels available in a digital format. The digital books can be assigned to students by their teacher and feature automatically marked quizzes linked to comprehension skills which assess students' understanding of the content. All students in K-2 have access to this program so please contact your class teacher if you have not received your child's login information.

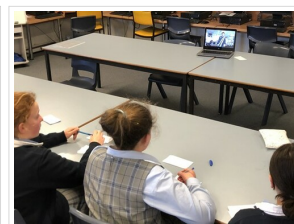
3-6 staff and some specialist staff were also introduced to the Leveled Literacy program which can be used for students not meeting grade-level expectations in reading as well as supporting students who are at or exceeding grade expectation in reading and comprehension. This resource contains 300 different books plus teacher resources designed to:

- Elevate the expertise of teachers
- Increase reading volume by engaging students in large amounts of successful daily reading
- Increase student engagement with books that build knowledge
- Intervene with small groups of readers to maximise growth
- Monitor student progress.

This Term, our school will be participating in the *Partners in Learning* parent survey, another part of the *Tell Them From Me* suite of surveys (student, teacher and parent surveys) on student engagement. Running this survey will help our school understand parents' and carers' perspectives on their child's experience at school. The survey is conducted entirely online on smartphones, iPads, tablets, laptops or computers. The survey will typically take 15 minutes or less to complete and is completely confidential. The parent survey will be conducted between 10 August and 25 September. Although participating in the survey is entirely voluntary, your responses are very much appreciated.

The survey is available in 23 languages.

Year 3 Maths Lesson

Once again Miss Cannell and Miss Morgan worked with a Year 3 maths group. The topic was fractions and the students worked in teams to find a fraction of a whole using string and pegs. They had a very successful and productive lesson and there are certainly some fraction whiz kids in Year 3! Here are some lesson reviews from Sloane and Alicia.

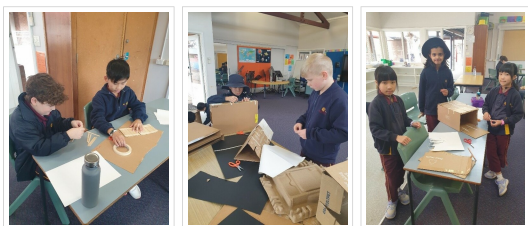
'Today we had a Maths lesson on fractions. The materials we used were pegs and rope. Miss Morgan gave us a fraction and we had to mark the spot on the rope with a peg that we thought the fraction was. It was so much fun!' *Sloane*

'Today, in Maths groups we were learning about fractions. My group was estimating the fractions $\frac{1}{10}$, $\frac{2}{5}$ and $\frac{1}{3}$. Using pegs, we found who got the closest guess. The first time Matthew was the closest. After that we discussed the use of formal and informal ways to measure to see who got the closest fraction. At the end of the lesson Miss Cannell asked us how to turn the fractions into decimals. It was the best ever Maths group lesson.' *Alicia*
