We have had one lovely family volunteer to look after the guinea pigs for a couple of weeks during the holidays. If your family can also help, please email the school, attention Mrs van Loon.


At the moment we have a lot of parsnips growing in the Eco Garden. We hope to pull them out next week. We would like to sell them next week at the front gate provided we can do this safely.

First Lap Voucher Program

This summer the First Lap voucher program will provide a new \$100 voucher to parents, guardians and carers of children aged 3-6 years who are not enrolled in school to help pay for swimming lessons. https://www.sport.nsw.gov.au/firstlap

In recognition that children in kindergarten have missed out on going to swimming lessons due to COVID-19 restrictions, this year the program has also been expanded to include children in kindergarten in 2021 and those starting kindergarten in 2022. The first \$100 voucher is available from 1 December 2021 and expires on 30 June 2022. A new \$100 voucher will become available on 1 July 2022. NSW children aged 4.5 to 18 years (enrolled in school from Kindergarten to Year 12) still have access to two \$100 Active Kids vouchers per year, which can be used towards the cost of sport and recreation activities.

Parents, guardians and carers have until 31 December to use this year's Active Kids vouchers with an approved provider. New vouchers will be available for 2022 from 1 January 2022.
