Yesterday was the Lindfield East PS Remembrance Day Assembly. This assembly was led by our school captains, Jisoo and Spencer. The message of the assembly allowed students to reflect and understand what our service men sacrificed for our country. Ms Read shared a very moving, personal story about her father and his life serving in World War 2, sharing photos and memorabilia. The assembly culminated with the Last Post, played by Lucy and Reveillelle played by Mateo.



Last week the Education Minister announced schools in greater Sydney will operate on updated Level 3 settings from 8 November for the rest of Term 4.

The changes support a greater range of activities to go ahead and also allow fully vaccinated providers and visitors on school sites to support curriculum delivery, wellbeing programs and school operations. To keep students and staff safe, schools will need to maintain cohorting and other COVID-safe layered measures at all times.

A combination of layered safety measures will continue to be in place. Only vaccinated people will be permitted on site, mask wearing, student cohorting, physical distancing, ventilation, hygiene and cleaning continue to allow us to prioritise student and staff wellbeing while we keep our school operational.

Year 4 Opportunity Class Test 2021

Students in Year 4 who applied for the Opportunity Class in 2022 will sit the test on Wednesday, 17th November at our school. The test will be computer-based, 60 minutes in total, and held in one single session. A new, modified timeline is being implemented to ensure students can be placed into Year 5 opportunity classes at the beginning of the 2022 school year.

School Sport Activities

School sport activities are allowed to proceed from 1 November 2021 for the rest of Term 4 with specific restrictions to align with NSW Public Health Orders and the reopening NSW roadmap.

School sport should be done in defined cohorts as part of re-establishing regular school timetabling and routines, and for the wellbeing of all students.

School sports across different cohorts is discouraged and schools are not permitted to enter into inter-school competitions during school hours until 2022.

Professor Sharon Goldfield - Paediatrician

This week the Secretary sat down for a short conversation with Professor Sharon Goldfeld, a paediatrician and Director of The Centre for Community Child Health. Professor Goldfeld has decades of experience in state government as a senior policy maker in health and education. During the 2020 second COVID-19 wave she analysed the school transmission data for the Victorian Department of Health and Human Services. During the discussion Sharon shares some practical tips for families when talking to children about COVID-19, the layers of protection in place in our schools, and the benefits of getting our students into the classroom to learn.

Bee Swarm Removal From The K-2 Playground

Last week in the K-2 playground a new bee hive was discovered as a queen bee had left her original hive to start a

new one. Bees swarm when they feel overcrowded, it is a natural occurrence. A swarm occurs when the queen bee, accompanied by several thousand worker bees leaves the nest (wild) or beehive and searches for a new home. Bees play an



important role in the pollination of agricultural crops, such as many of our nuts, fruit and vegetables. As bees are considered vulnerable we wanted to ensure that we nurtured this new hive with safe removal. The school contacted a local amateaur beekeeper who came to the school to collect the swarm. We found Thomas's number on this website https://www.beekeepers.asn.au/swarms

He came to the school, moved the virgin queen bee to a beehive box. The box was then relocated somewhere nearby so all the bees could find their way to the queen. Thomas came back later that night to move the box to a safe location.

If you ever have a bee swarm in your backyard or local area please do not try and kill or interfere with the bees - you are likely to anger the bees and get stung. The bees will not harm you if they are left alone! There are people in the community who can remove the bees safely and sustainably.

Student Self-Isolate

Update advise for families when a student is a close contact but cannot self-isolate on their own.

In instances where parents or carers deem that their child is not able to isolate by themselves, they may designate a person in their household to care for the child while they are a close contact. If the carer is fully vaccinated, they do not need to co-isolate with the child (they can leave the home).

The published state-wide Year 6 to 7 orientation date is 23 November 2021. Due to the delayed HSC this date is not suitable for some schools. The high school principals will work with the Director, Educational Leadership and community of schools to arrange an appropriate orientation program, which may occur after the HSC exams. We will inform all Year 6 families as soon as we have a confirmed date for transition to highschool visit. For the purposes of orientation visits to a high school, Year 6 students will be required to wear masks indoors. Student Attendance at School

All students are expected to be at school unless they are unwell. Please do not send your child to attend school if they are unwell, even with mild symptoms. The following directions are from the Department of Education and NSW Health.:

Get tested for COVID-19 and follow:

If you have any COVID-19 symptoms you will be sent home and must not return to school unless you have either:

- isolated for 10 days, when no medical certificate is available
- a negative COVID-19 test result and are symptom free

In circumstances where a student has other medical reasons for recurrent symptoms, a letter from your GP is sufficient to negate the requirement for a negative test.

Self-isolation periods and testing requirements differ for close contacts based on their exposure and vaccination status. If you are identified as a close contact, an authorised contact tracer from NSW Health or from the department's Health and Safety Directorate will contact you and let you what you need to do.
