Student Return

As we have all the students K-6 back at school, face to face learning has recommenced. All the students are back into their routines and classrooms ready for learning. The staff at LEPS are enjoying having their students back at school where it is much easier to support student learning and student wellbeing. It has been lovely seeing the students with their friends and interacting with each other.



Now that we are finally back at school together, everyday is valuable for school attendance. The school day starts at 8:45am, this bell indicates the start of the school day and a teacher will be on duty to supervise your child from this time. Please try and avoid arriving late to school, after the 9:15am bell, as this means your child will miss important lesson instructions at the start of the day. These late arrivals are marked as partial absences on the school roll.

Students are able to easily check their playground as there are timetables placed throughout the school.

The canteen is open for online orders only. The class tubs will be collected from outside the canteen area each morning tea and lunchtime so the teachers can then distribute the orders.

We would also like to thank the ongoing work of our cleaners and our Enhanced Cleaning team for their work during the day. The number 1 priority is the regular cleaning of our toilets and other high touch areas throughout the school. Our toilets are cleaned and checked for supplies every hour. Students are taken regularly to the bathroom through the day with the teacher. The students are not restricted to these times and can go to the bathroom anytime of the day.

Kindergarten can also utilise the toilets in their classroom, Year 1-2 have priority access to the K-2 toilets during class time and Years 3-6 use the library toilets that are situated close to their classrooms during class time. These have been carefully segregated to ensure the grades don't mix and younger students feel comfortable going to the bathroom.

Toilet Upgrade Update and Other Projects

We are very lucky at LEPS to have the 3-6 toilet renovation in action, with a wonderful upgrade for our 3-6 toilets. Thank you to the community feedback on the 3-6 toilets quoting, that they were in need of repair and the request for this upgrade allowed our school to follow this up as a priority.

The renovation has made tremendous progression and the unveiling of our completed toilets are scheduled for the end of November.

We were very fortunate to get this project which proceeded at the beginning of Term 4. If it had been scheduled during the Christmas break, it would not have been completed due to continuous interruptions of public holidays and would have not been ready for the beginning of the 2022 school year. Ms Read has been negotiating the LEPS next upgrade within our school which is our asphalt throughout the playgrounds. This is a major project and has been scheduled for the December school holidays whilst there are no students on site due to the major disruptions this would incur.

Thank you to our BaSC for their kind donation of \$50 000 for the purchase of new K-2 fixed play equipment. This project is currently in the planning phase.

This term we will also see the installation of solar panels. Thank you to the hard work of the P&C and Ms Read who worked closely together to successfully receive a grant to fund this project.

Child Protection Education

This term students will be involved in the mandatory subject Personal Development, Health and Physical Education (PDHPE).

Part of our school's PDHPE program includes mandatory child protection education. Some of the content taught in child protection education deals with sensitive issues. This will be taught in an age appropriate way by classroom teachers.

Year 1 Phonics Screening Check

The Year 1 Phonics Screening Check is a quick assessment that tells teachers how your child is progressing in phonics. Phonics is important for students who are learning to read. This screening check observes how your child can read words with different letter combinations. The main purpose of the Year 1 Phonics Screening Check is to provide your child's teacher with information which will allow them to plan for your child's learning. Each child is individually assessed by a teacher and all Year 1 students will be assessed over the next 2 weeks.

Check-in Assessment for Years 3-6

Students in Year 3-6 will participate in a Reading and Numeracy Check-in assessment over Weeks 7 and 8.

The Check-in Assessment is a NSW Department of Education online reading and numeracy assessment available to support schools to assess and monitor student learning.

The assessments can supplement existing school practices to identify how students are performing and to help teachers tailor their teaching more specifically to student needs.

Students will be asked to bring headphones or earbuds that plug into a computer to enable them to hear audio during the assessment.
